

The start of a new year is a busy time for schools. The first few days before students' return is a time of professional learning and setting up of our learning spaces in readiness for the first school day for our students. This year our staff have participated in many professional learning sessions; including a staff induction, spelling workshops, Lifting Literacy workshop and First Aid Training.

We have had a wonderful, calm and settled start to the new year and that is thanks to the careful planning and consideration of our staff to help prepare students for their return.





# **Allergy Aware School Policy**

At Blackmans Bay Primary School, we aim to provide a safe and healthy learning environment for all. We currently have several students at our school that have a potentially life-threatening allergy. The key to prevention of anaphylaxis in schools is for us to work in partnership with our families to ensure that certain foods or items are kept away from school, but it is important to remember it is never totally possible to eliminate the risk of anaphylaxis altogether.

To protect all students, we kindly ask that families do not send any nut products to school (almond, cashew, pistachio, hazelnut, and peanuts). We would also like to ask that families do not send any food items for sharing to the school. This includes cakes and special items that are often shared for a child's birthday. Instead of these items, your classroom teacher will be finding school-based ways to celebrate your child and recognise their birthday. This might include a special activity or class game and an opportunity to talk about their birthday with the class.

A copy of our Allergy Aware School Policy can be found on our website, but we appreciate your understanding of this and your willingness to ensure we keep all our students safe when they are school.

#### School Rules and Values

At Blackmans Bay Primary School our behaviours and thinking are guided by the DECYP values and our school rules. As a school we spend a considerable amount of time focused on teaching these to our students so that our expectations are clear and understood.

## **Together We Can**





Together We Can is an important part of our whole school approach to improve reading outcomes and it has been developed to support each child with developing the necessary skills to be successful with their reading.

By encouraging regular reading with your child and by asking a few questions about the book, you are encouraging the development of fluency (steady pace), comprehension (understanding) and promoting the importance of becoming a successful reader.

Every child (Prep-Year 6) will be given a *Together We Can* booklet and folder. When your child has read for 20 days (note: you can only record one session per day), then the teacher can prepare a certificate which will be presented in assembly.

We have published a short video on our social media (Facebook and Instagram) that explains *Together We Can* in some more detail.

When a child has read 100 reading sessions, your child will be presented with a 100 certificate in assembly and invited to pick a book prize from the principal's office. Both the certificate and the book prize will be awarded to your child at the next assembly.

#### Sun Safe





School hats can be purchased from our Uniform Shop via Qkr! Please remember to write your child's name on <u>all</u> uniform items so any lost items are easily identified.


# **Library News**

# **Social and Emotional Learning**

During Terms 1 and 2 we are introducing a school approach to social and emotional learning. This is foundational to our school improvement plan inquiry question -'How can we work together to ensure all children and young people are known, safe, well and learning?'This focus also connects to our Safeguarding commitments and the DECYP strategic plan 2024 – 2030. A focus on developing social and emotional competencies assists students to understand themselves and others, manage relationships, lives and learning. The DECYP Social and Emotional Teaching Learning package assists teachers to create and maintain a safe and inclusive learning environment. It complements other social emotional learning resources and strategies already in place at Blackmans Bay Primary All classes will timetable weekly explicit teaching of social and emotional skills focused on social and emotional wellbeing, connection and belonging.

# 2025 Volunteer Requirements

As we kick off the new school year, we want to remind our school community about the important requirements for volunteering at our school.

To ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students, it is mandatory for all volunteers to have their RWVP (Registration for Working with Vulnerable People) and to have completed the Our Obligations – Safeguarding Training 15-minute video before engaging with children and young people in a volunteer capacity at our school. Certificates for the training video are valid for 12 months from the date of completion. These steps are essential in helping us maintain a safe and supportive environment for our children.
