Premier's Reading Challenge



The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is being offered to our students once again, and we encourage everyone from Kinder to Year 6 to be involved. Participating students aim to read 10 books in 10 weeks. Students may also set their own reading goals to read more than 10. Books may include novels, picture books, eBooks, newspapers, magazines, home readers or anything else you think qualifies. Students may read the books themselves or be read the books by a sibling or adult or listen to an audio book. A student reading a large novel may, with discussion with families or teachers, count a certain number of chapters, as a book. The challenge begins Monday 16 June and finishes Sunday 24 August. Please note that the books read can be used for both the Together We Can program and the PRC. Perhaps there are family members who would like to challenge themselves also and encourage the participating student!

Book Reviews in 2025!

Students are encouraged to share what they are reading by writing a book review for the PRC website. They can submit a review at any time during the Challenge using this <u>online form</u> (open from 16 June). Book Reviews will be updated at the end of each week of the Challenge.

By submitting a book review, students go into the draw to win a \$50 book voucher. There are 12 up for grabs, 4 for each region! The prizes will be drawn once the PRC has finished, and the PRC Team will contact the PRC Coordinator or family of the winning students.


