

Supporting Every Student's Literacy Journey: Our Approach

At our school, we're committed to making sure every child and young person receives the literacy support they need—when they need it. That's why we use a consistent, evidence-based approach across all Department schools called the **Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)**.

Here's how MTSS works:

- **Tier 1** For all students: Every child is taught to read using proven, evidence-based teaching strategies.
- **Tier 2** For some students: Those who need extra time and practice with specific literacy skills work in smaller groups. Once they've mastered the skill, they return to Tier 1.

• **Tier 3** – For a few students: These learners receive one-on-one support to help them learn specific literacy skills, alongside the learning in Tiers 1..

This system ensures that every student gets the right amount of help at the right time. Whether it's extra practice or individual support, MTSS is our way of making sure no student is left behind in their literacy journey.

If you have any questions or would like to learn more about how your child's learning is supported, please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's class teacher.

Year 5-6C Maths

Students in Year 5-6 C have been engaging in a hands-on problem-solving session where they had to put their heads together to solve numerical, spatial, chance and data and logic problems. They were fully engaged and very proud of their achievements. It was wonderful to see their motivation and perseverance. Maths is a wonderful opportunity for students to learn as collaborators and thinkers and provides an authentic opportunity to communicate your thinking and ideas. Well done 5-6C.

Student Absences

In Tasmania, students can only miss a day of school where there is a medical reason, or a set of special circumstances.

If your child is absent for a reason that isn't authorised, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

Absences for Illness

It may be requested that a medical certificate or further evidence (such as a statutory declaration) are provided to explain an absence for illness if any student has been away for more than 5 days in a school year (not necessarily consecutively). Please be aware absences beyond 5 days will be recorded as unauthorised until such documentation has been provided, or at discretion following Principal's further discussions with individual families.

A letter to inform you of your child's attendance will be generated when your child reaches 5, 10 and 15 unauthorised absences within a school year and we may request that you attend a meeting to make a personalised plan to support your child's attendance.

- A reminder to families that all absences must be reported directly to the school office.
- The preferred method for advising absences at our school is via Schoolzine, however notification can also be provided in person, email or by phoning the school office on 6229 6637.
- Please notify the office prior to 9:00am on the day of a student's absence. Any

notifications received after this time will likely still generate a request via Edsmart to contact the school. A reminder also that if your child(ren) are not in class by 8.55am, they must be signed in on the kiosk at the office to ensure their attendance is correctly recorded. Students must also be signed out at the office if they are collected early.

 If there are ever any concerns regarding your child's attendance, please contact the school office.

School Carparks

The safety of all children is paramount, and we need to ensure that all families can use the designated parking areas safely. To allow families to use the Pickup and Drop-off Zone, we would like to remind all families that this area within the Opal Drive carpark is a **No Parking Zone** between 8.30am – 9.05am and again from 2.40pm – 3.10pm.

Our Roslyn Avenue carpark is for **STAFF PARKING ONLY**. Visitor carparks in this area are only to be utilised by families when collecting/dropping off students outside of usual school start and end times (for example, student unwell or attending appointment during school hours).
